

ARTPRENEUR OTTAWA CONFERENCE

AOE Arts Council collaborated with the Ottawa School of Art, the Shenkman Arts Centre and Wallack's Art Supplies to organize an annual one-day conference dedicated to helping artists succeed. On October 18, creative experts motivated and informed artists on how to transform their passions into professions.

AOE GALLERY

Presented by Desjardins, the 2014 season of 9 exhibits and 'meet the artist' afternoons featured the works of 11 visual artists: Sandra Marshall & Barbara Adams (Jan-Feb), John F. Marok (Feb-Mar), Nath (Mar-Apr), Edna Lemyre (Apr-May), Marc Gagne (June), Vladimir Frolov (August), Alan Bain (Sept-Oct), Mary Kritz & Rebecca Cowan (Oct-Nov) and Valeriya Khomar (Nov-Jan). The AOE Gallery provides members a public exhibition space to share and sell their work.



SELECTIONS EXHIBITION

57 works by 50 AOE Arts Council members were juried from 280 submissions, and on exhibit in the Trinity Art Gallery at the Shenkman Arts Centre from Sept. 25 to Oct. 21. The works explored different disciplines such as photography, painting, sculpture, marguetry, drawing, mixed media, printmaking, book arts and textile arts.

Over 1,000 attended the exhibit and an enthusiastic crowd of over 150 attended the vernissage on Sept. 25 where the honour of Juror's Choice Awards went to Marie Paquette for 'Nuit blanche' (Chinese ink), Mark Stephenson for 'Pondering' (painting), and Krystyna Sadej for 'Transformation - Ugly Duckling' (textile art). The public bestowed the People's Choice Award to sculptor Maria Saracino for her work 'The Selfie'.



YOUTH OPPORTUNITIES

The Arts Council is committed to providing opportunities for the next generation offering practical work experience. Ottawa U student, Annie Taylor did an internship on a grant from the City of Ottawa and two students had Canada Summer Jobs positions. Coop students from La Cité and Béatrice Desloges Secondary School.

CELEBRATING SHENKMAN ARTS CENTRE 5TH ANNIVERSARY

AOE Arts Council engaged the community to participate in an exciting community art project led by textile artist Karen Goetzinger, entitled 'Significant Connections.' 400 participants folded origami shapes that served as the foundational pieces in the construction of a large scale dimensional artwork using donated specialty papers, artist test papers, sketches, children's paintings and drawings, calligraphy or works of art on paper. The project was installed in the upper lobby of the Shenkman Arts Centre.





ARTINIS

Our annual ARTinis benefit soirée at the Shenkman Arts Centre, provided 250 artists and art lovers, business and community leaders a chance to mingle and show their generous support for the Arts Council's activities. Guests were invited to walk through artistic installations in a temporary 'Water'- themed gallery with: photography by Ruth Dick, sculpture installation by Karen Goetzinger (shown in the photo), mixed media by Zivana Kostic, book arts and paper demonstration by Mary Kritz, video installation by Cheryl Pagurek, and media, dj and video performance by The Latest Artists.

NUIT BLANCHE OTTAWA+GATINEAU

Nuit Blanche Ottawa+Gatineau (NBOG) is a one night, dusk-until-dawn celebration of contemporary art and local culture that takes place across multiple venues and within the cityscape of Ottawa and Gatineau. AOE Arts Council partnered with NBOG to assist with the artist open call, to develop a marketing plan and promote the event.

AOE Arts Council also hosted an artist Human Library during the third annual event held on September 20, 2014. 19 artists/books were available for one-on-one conversation with over 240 visitors about their art, influences and life.
