It is with great pleasure that we present the 2011 Annual Report of the ARTicipate Endowment Fund.



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

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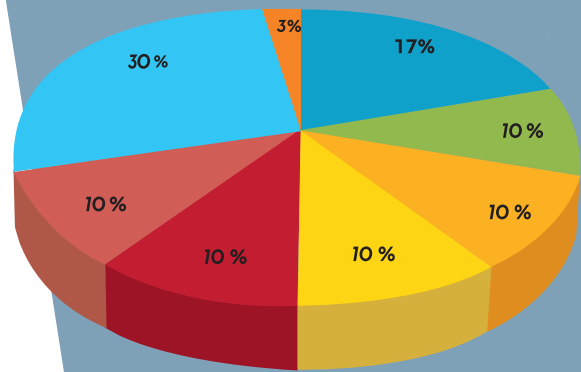
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2011 ARTICIPATE ENDOWMENT FUND INTEREST INCOME DISTRIBUTION

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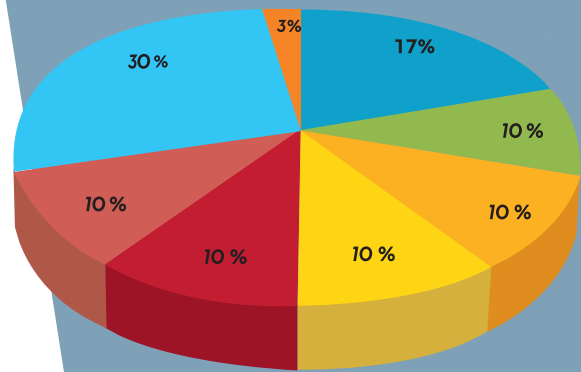
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
