


WHO WE ARE

Since 1987, Arts Network Ottawa has been building a healthy and sustainable arts sector by creating professional development and mentorship opportunities for artists; providing resources and promotion to advance the careers of artists and cultural workers; and collaborating through partnerships to advocate the creative, social and economic benefits the arts play in a flourishing community.

As a membership-based bilingual arts service organization, we are an informed voice for a network of artists, cultural workers and arts organizations across the Ottawa region. By advancing careers, we support our 400 members and also Ottawa's arts community at large.

As an organization, our strategic priority for 2019 is to increase the organizational capacity to have the necessary resources and expertise to deliver our mission.



ENGAGEMENT & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

NEIGHBOURHOOD ARTS | Neighbourhood Arts Ottawa gives professional artists and arts groups the opportunity to work directly with community members, build relationships with community groups such as public libraries and community health centres and residents, and mentor emerging artists.

In our second year of a three-year Grow Grant from Ontario Trillium Foundation Grant, the four project leads and their partners for 2019 were Christine Mockett with Ottawa Coalition of Community Houses; Melanie Yugo with Pinecrest-Queensway Community Health Centre and CSC Vanier; Branch Out Theatre with Immigrant Women's Services Ottawa and Catholic Centre for Immigrants; and MASC Awesome Arts Festival with Sandy Hill Community Centre.

In March, Neighbourhood Arts Ottawa hosted a two-day **Community-Engaged Arts Symposium** featuring panelists including MASC, World of Folk Music Ottawa, Trophy, CSArts Ottawa and our own Neighbourhood Arts Ottawa participants.

Additionally, we hosted an Artist Talk with Mique Michelle (May 10), **Get. Together.** co-presented with YALC featuring panelists Rachel Weldon, Elsa Mirzaei, Jordan David and Alejandro Salgado Cendales moderated by Lenore Gale (August 27) and a **Paint in the Park** networking event in Minto Park with 12 local artists.

ARTPRENEUR CONFERENCE | held May 31 at Bayview Yards in collaboration with Wallack's, Shifter Agency, City of Ottawa and Invest Ottawa. This one-day cross-disciplinary event for creative entrepreneurs bridges art, film and music to address the theme of "Creative Infrastructure". 150 attendees heard from 13 industry professionals among 11 vendors in the Expo Hall.

EXHIBITION SPACE @ ARTS NETWORK OTTAWA | Twelve members shared their work with the public as part of the 2019 exhibition season: Laura Ayayi, Josée Francoeur, Natalie Frenière and Lise. B. Goulet, Daniel Morales-Gómez, Donna Quince, Roger Sutcliffe, and featured another 32 members at the Member Holiday Marketplace in December.

We showcased another 15 members in the **Shenkman Arts Centre display case** in the Upper Lobby during September.

INFOARTSNETWORK KIOSKS | On behalf of our members, distribution of over 9,544 pieces of marketing and promotional material to 13 locations across the City.

YALC An initiative of Arts Network Ottawa, the Young Arts Leaders Collective (YALC) is a group that supports the professional development of young emerging artists and arts administrators in Ottawa. Young Arts Leaders Collective offered a gathering on Balance October 24 featuring Fabien Laurent, Brit Johston, Alan André and Claire Farley as part of the **Get. Together.** Series.

COLLABORATION & PARTNERSHIPS

CPAMO (Cultural Pluralism in the Arts Movement) Ottawa was established to increase awareness of the presence and importance of pluralism in the arts for Indigenous and diverse artists, arts organizations, communities and audiences in the Capital Region, and to provide a forum for sharing information and growing partnerships in support. This project is funded by the Ontario Arts Council and led by Alicia Borisonik. In 2019, CPAMO offered three facilitated gatherings on Pitching to Presenters (Jan. 31), Grant and Proposal Writing (March 8) and Grant Writing Deep Dive (May 3).

Digital Tour - La Tournée numérique | Arts Network Ottawa, Culture Outaouais, and Théâtre Action were proud to launch in the Digital Tour in 2019 with a Tourism and Culture grant. This free 5-step event for artists, workers and cultural organizations in the Outaouais and Ottawa region, with an aim to demystify and appropriate the digital world. A total of 14 cultural and educational organizations based in Ottawa and Outaouais worked together to provide panels, workshops and networking events.

Shenkman Arts Centre Community Leadership Team – we helped assure that the voice of the local arts community was heard at the Centre's planning, programming and promotional levels.

Arts Entrepreneur and Career Management – an intensive 6-part course in English was offered in 2018 designed for independent Ottawa region artists, arts collectives and arts groups offered with support from Ontario Arts Council and WorkinCulture and featuring Ethel Côté (MécènESS) Manu Sharma (CSED), Susan Henry (Alterna Savings), Byron Pascoe (Edwards PC, Creative Law) and Peter Georgariou (Karma Darma).

ARTICIPATE ENDOWMENT FUND STEWARDSHIP

The ARTicipate Endowment Fund was established in 2007 by Arts Network Ottawa in partnership with the City of Ottawa to support artistic programming in professional spaces at the Shenkman Arts Centre. Arts Network Ottawa is the steward of the \$5,000,000 fund and is responsible for its promotion, administration and sustainability.

In 2019, the Fund distributed a total of \$105,000 in grants. The Fund supports the work of the Centre's Resident Arts Partners: Arts Network Ottawa, Gloucester Pottery School, MIFO, Ottawa School of Art, and Ottawa School of Theatre.


