ARTICIPATE PROJECT GRANT PROGRAM

The annual ARTicipate Project Grants enable regional artists and art organisations access to the Shenkman Arts Centre's professional spaces for creating and presenting their work.

Artistic project submissions are selected by a jury. The 2014-15 ARTicipate project grant jurors were: Laura Astwood, Sarah Conn, Andrew Morrow.

For 2014-15, a total of \$15,195 in grant funding was awarded to seven artists and five art organisations across the arts spectrum.
